In, On, At

The words in, on, and at are all prepositions used to describe time and place.

On	Indicates a specific time or location. When talking about time, use on when referring to dates. <i>She climbed on the sofa. She arrived on Monday.</i>
At	Indicates a specific time or place. Use at to refer to particular points on the clock or to particular points in the day or week. <i>Mom is at work. The doorbell rang at midnight.</i>
In	Indicates a larger, more general time or location. Use in to refer to long periods of time like decades and centuries. <i>I live in the city. That happened in the eighties.</i>
