In, On, At



The words in, on, and at are all prepositions used to describe time and place.

On	Indicates a specific time or location. When talking about time, use on when referring to dates. She climbed on the sofa. She arrived on Monday.
At	Indicates a specific time or place. Use at to refer to particular points on the clock or to particular points in the day or week. Mom is at work. The doorbell rang at midnight.
In	Indicates a larger, more general time or location. Use in to refer to long periods of time like decades and centuries. <i>I live in the city. That happened in the eighties.</i>
