Interjections

An interjection is a word or phrase used to express a feeling. Injections are set off from the rest of the sentence with punctuation. Use a comma to set off interjections that express mild feelings. Use an exclamation mark to set off interjections that express very strong feelings. For example:



Um, will you please stop playing that bugle?

Wow! You are a great bugle player!
