The words to, too, and two are homophones: words that sound the same, but which have different meanings.

To is a preposition that expresses movement or direction:
We drove to the mall. I will add my name to the list.
Too means also, or to a greater degree:
I want to go too. It is too small.
Two is a number: I have two dogs.
