Will vs. Going To

Use **will**: To make decisions that are made at the time of speaking
To state a fact about the future
To make a promise
To make a prediction
With words like *I think, I hope, I guess, probably and possibly*

Use **be going to**: If talking about a future event that has been planned before the time of speaking
To make a future prediction based on facts or evidence
