7.	Evidence can include your opinion.	
8.	Claim is another word for fact.	
9.	Without evidence to support it, a claim is nothing more than an opinion.	
10.	Evidence should justify why a claim is valid.	
11.	If a position cannot be debated, it is not a claim.
