Gerund Phrases

A gerund phrase consists of the gerund, which always ends in -ing, and any modifiers and/or complements. A gerund phrase always functions in a sentence as a noun.

- <u>Having pets</u> is good for our health.
 (The gerund phrase is the subject of the verb is).
- John remembered <u>giving me the book</u>.
 (The gerund phrase is the direct object of remembered).
- <u>After thinking</u> about it, we made the decision. (The gerund phrase is the object of the preposition after.)
