Annotated Bibliography

In a bibliography, an annotation is extra information about a text. An annotation can make a meaningful comment, explain something, or even pose a question.



An **annotated bibliography** is a bibliography that includes an annotation with each listed source. The annotations in a bibliography can describe the source; summarize the source; evaluate the source; or any combination of these. An annotation can be a phrase, a sentence, or whole paragraphs. The paragraph style is best suited for combination annotations.
