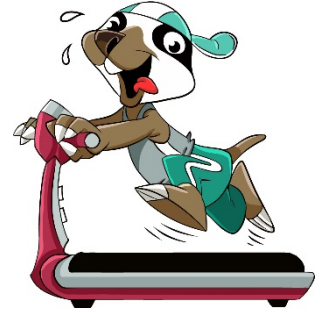


# Adjective vs. Adverb
