A gerund phrase consists of the gerund, which always ends in -ing, and any modifiers and/or complements. A gerund phrase always functions in a sentence as a noun.

- Eating orange vegetables is good for your eyes.
(The gerund phrase is the subject of the verb is).
- Rachel appreciates solving complicated puzzles.
(The gerund phrase is the direct object of appreciates).
- By revealing his cover, the detective was compromised.
(The gerund phrase is the object of the preposition after).
