Do, Does, Did

The words do, does, and did are all forms of the verb **to do**. The verb to do can be an action verb or an auxiliary (helping) verb.

Do is the present tense form of the verb to do:


I do. You do. We do. They do.

Does is the third person singular present tense form of to do:

He does. She does. Janet does. Henry does.

Did is the past tense form of the verb to do.

I did. You did. He did. She did. They did. We did.
