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## To, Too, Two

The words to, too, and two are homophones: words that sound the same, but which have different meanings.

To is a preposition that expresses movement or direction:

We walked to the park. I will add a paragraph to my essay.

Too means also, or to a greater degree:

I want one too. It is too cold in here.

**Two** is a number: I have *two* red dresses.
