



Annotation

An annotation is extra information associated with a particular place in a text. An annotation can be a comment or an explanation. Many people put annotations right in the margins of a text as they are reading. Annotating a text helps you to:

- Keep track of key ideas and questions
- Think more deeply about what you have read
- Analyze and interpret a text
- Make inferences and draw conclusions about a text
- Easily find something in a text again without having to reread it
