Modal auxiliaries modify the mood of a verb. *May* is used to express permission or possibility. The negative of *may* is *may not*. *Might* is used to express a smaller possibility. The negative of *might* is *might not*.



I may figure out how to use this hula hoop.

I might become the world hula hoop champion.
