

Forms of Compound Nouns

A compound word is a word that is made up of two smaller words. A compound noun can take one of three forms:

- In the open or spaced form, there is a space between words (washing machine)
- In the hyphenated form, there is a hyphen between words (six-pack)
- In the closed or solid form, there is no space or hyphen between words (inside)
