

# Indefinite Pronouns



An indefinite pronoun is one that does not refer to any definite or specific person, place or thing. Indefinite pronouns can be singular, plural, or both (depending on their meaning in a sentence).

Singular	Plural	Both
anybody, anyone, anything, each, either, everybody, everyone, everything, neither, nobody, no one, nothing, one, somebody, someone, and something.	both, few, many, several.	all, any, more, most, none, and some

In the sentences below, the indirect pronoun is underlined; the verb is in italics.

<u>Neither</u> of the dogs is friendly. (singular)	<u>None</u> of the dogs are hungry. (plural)
<u>Both</u> of the dogs are playful. (plural)	<u>None</u> of the dog is wet. (singular)
