Gerunds Used as Subjects

A gerund is the -ing form of a verb that is used as a noun. The gerund is formed by adding the suffix "-ing" to a verb. Gerunds that come after the main verb in a sentence are used as direct objects.

Gerunds that come before the main verb are used as subjects.
