



# Must vs. Have to

*Must* has two functions.

- It expresses a strong belief that is based on logic, rather than fact.
- It expresses an obligation whose source is **internal** (coming from oneself).

The negative of *must* is *must not* or the contraction *mustn't*.

*Have to* has two similar functions.

- Like *must*, it expresses a strong belief that is based on logic, rather than fact.
- It expresses an obligation whose source is **external** (coming from your boss, the law, an authority).

The negative of *have* is *do not have to*.
