Must vs. Have to

Must has two functions.

- It expresses a strong belief that is based on logic, rather than fact.
- It expresses an obligation whose source is internal (coming from oneself).

The negative of must is *must not* or the contraction *mustn't*.

Have to has two similar functions.

- Like *must*, it expresses a strong belief that is based on logic, rather than fact.
- It expresses an obligation whose source is external (coming from your boss, the law, an authority).

The negative of have is do not have to.
