Choosing an Organizational Structure

The following are some logical organizational structures that are each particularly suited to specific kinds of information:

- *Order of location* groups information according to shared locations (states, regions, etc.)
- Chronological order present information in the order in which it happened.
- A problem/solution structure begins with the problem and then discusses how the problem was solved.
- *Inverted pyramid* structure begins with the most important information and proceeds in order or decreasing importance.
- **Deductive order** begins with a generalization (i.e., a theme, a point, etc.) and then supports the generalization with specifics.
- Inductive order begins with specifics and leads the reader to a generalization about the information.
- Priority sequence ranks information in order from the most important to the least important.
