## Idiom

An idiom is a saying that has a figurative meaning that is different from its literal meaning.

**EXAMPLE**: Kenny walked up to Jane and said, "A penny for your thoughts."

A penny for your thoughts is the idiom in the sentence. Kenny doesn't mean that he's going to give Jane a penny, he is using the phrase figuratively. It's figurative meaning is, "What are you thinking?"

The sentences below express literal thoughts. Rewrite each sentence using an idiom instead.
