## **Transitions of Addition/Agreement**

Transition words are used in a sentence to connect two ideas. They join clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or entire sections of writing together to show a relationship between them. Different transition words signal different kinds of relationships. One kind of relationship that transition words can signal between ideas is addition, agreement, or reinforcement. For example:



in addition	by the same token	in the same vein
equally	moreover	similarly
as well as	furthermore	not to mention
