The U.S. Capitol is a building in Washington D.C. that houses the legislative branch of the U.S. government. The construction of the building began in 1793, and the cornerstone was laid by President George Washington. The architecture of this symbolic U.S. building, which covers four acres, was inspired by the architecture of Ancient Greece and Rome. The term Capitol Hill refers to the entire U.S. Capitol Complex, which includes the U.S. Capitol Building, the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate office buildings, and the Library of Congress.
