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## Palindrome



A palindrome is a kind of word play in which a word, phrase, or even a whole sentence is spelled the same way forwards as it is backwards. The word palindrome was coined by the poet and playwright Ben J ohnson in the early 1600s. It is a combination of two Greek root words: palin, which means "again," and dromos, which means "direction."
