

Anaphora

Anaphora is a rhetorical device consisting of repetition of a word or phrase at the beginning of successive phrases, clauses, or sentences in order to create emphasis.

The word anaphora comes from the Greek meaning "reference" or "carry back."

Example:

Practice long.

Practice hard.

Practice as if your life depended on it.
