Transitions of Location/Place

Transition words are used in a sentence to connect two ideas. They join clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or entire sections of writing together to show a relationship between them. Different transition words signal different kinds of relationships. One kind of relationship that transition words can signal between ideas is location or place. Transitions of location/place can sometimes overlap with or into transitions of time and sequence. Examples of transitions of location/place are:

in the middle	in the background	near	across
above	under	further	alongside
between	beyond	down	beneath
throughout	on top of	into	among
