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## Word Stress and Part of Speech

Some words can be either nouns or verbs. Often, you can tell whether a word is functioning in a sentence as a noun or a verb by which syllable of the word is stressed. In the example below, the stressed syllable in the word is underlined.

I read the <u>ab</u>stract (noun) for that paper.

I am trying to abstract (verb) some meaning from this.
