

Implications | Assumptions

Sometimes, in presenting evidence, you need to introduce something that is implied or assumed. In other words, it is not directly stated by the author, but it is logical conclusion that you have drawn from the author's work. In these cases, it is best to use the words implication or assumption so it is clear to your reader where this evidence comes from. For example:
