3.	The Tea Act	This Act gave a monopoly on tea sales in the colonies to the British East India Company. If the Colonists wanted tea, they had to buy it from this British company and thus pay taxes to the British government without representation.
2.	The Townshend Act	Imposed tax on common goods such as tea, glass, and paper. The colonists were paying these taxes without representation in the British government.
4.	The Intolerable Acts	These Acts were passed by the British government in retaliation for the destruction of British property that occurred during the Boston Tea Party.
1.	The Stamp Act	Prompted the formation of the Sons of Liberty to protest the Act. The Sons of Liberty later carried out the Boston Tea Party.
