

-tion | -ive Pattern

A suffix is a word part added to the end of a base or root word that modifies or changes the meaning of a word. Sometimes suffixes also change the word's part of speech.

The suffix **-tion** means "the action of" or "the result of."
Adding the suffix -tion to a verb creates a noun.



The suffix **-ive** means "tending to," "doing," or "being."
Adding the suffix -ive to a noun creates an adjective.
