Combined Sources of Uncertainty

Many words and phrases act like markers in a text to indicate to readers that the author is less than certain about what is being said. Collectively, these words and phrases that indicate uncertainty are called **uncertainty qualifiers**. In any given text, there can be many sources of uncertainty that combine to give the reader an overall level of confidence in the text, or a lack thereof.
