| Word | Roots | Origin | Meaning |
|--------------|------------------------------------|--------|---|
| invective | invehere/invectivus = attacking | Latin | insulting, abusive, or highly critical language |
| expletive | ex = out; plere = fill | Latin | an oath or swear word |
| vituperation | vituperatio = blame, censuring | Latin | harsh and angry criticism |

They all have to do with harsh, negative language.

| Word | Roots | Origin | Meaning |
|-------------|---|--------|---|
| probability | L. probabilis, provable or credible | Latin | the extent to which something is likely to happen |
| probate | L. probare, to test or prove | Latin | the official proving of a will |

They both have to do with proving/proof
