

Palindrome Names

A palindrome is a kind of word play in which a word, phrase, or even a whole sentence is spelled the same way forwards as it is backwards. Some names are palindromes, like Bob and Eve. The word palindrome was coined by the poet and playwright Ben Johnson in the early 1600s. It is a combination of two Greek root words: *palin*, which means "again," and *dromos*, which means "direction."
