



# Spotting Uncertainty in Texts

Many words and phrases act like markers in a text to indicate to readers that the author is less than certain about what is being said. Collectively, these words and phrases that indicate uncertainty are called **uncertainty qualifiers**. These markers in the text help readers to identify where the author is uncertain, or how much confidence the author has in what they are saying.
