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## Spelling Rules



DIRECTIONS: Write a word that is an example of each spelling rule.

Every word has at least one vowel.
Every syllable has at least one vowel.
C can say/k/ or /s/. C says /s/ before an e, i, or y .
C says/k/ before everything else.
G can say /g/ or /j/. G may say /j/ before an e, i, or y. $\qquad$
G says/g/before everything else.
Q is always followed by a $u$.
Double the consonants $f, l$, and $s$ at the end of a onesyllable word that has just one vowel.

To spell the sound of $/ \mathrm{k} /$ at the end of a word, we use ck or k. Use ck after a short vowel.

To spell the sound of $/ \mathrm{k} /$ after everything else, use a k .
Capitalize names.
A, e, o, and $u$ usually say their name at the end of a syllable.

Words do not end in vorj. We add a silent e at the end of the word.

Contractions replace letter(s) with an apostrophe to shorten a phrase.

I and o may say $\sqrt{1 /}$ and /ō/ before two consonants.
/j/ is spelled dge after a short vowel.
Capitalize the names of places.
