## **Resolving Narratives**

The resolution of a story follows the climax and ties all the narrative arcs together. The resolution doesn't just end the story, it gives the reader of sense of how the character's lives will continue beyond the end of the story, both for stand-alone stories and series.

A good resolution includes three key elements:

- It resolves the stories main conflicts.
- It completes character arcs.
- It answers any last remaining reader questions.



Additional responsibilities may include:

- Fulfilling any promises of the genre
- Reiterating theme
- Setting up a series or sequel
