

Suffixes for People



A suffix is extra letters at the end of a word that tell you more about it. When you add the suffix -er to the end of a verb, you make a word that names someone who does something, something that does something, or someone who provides or is involved with something.

EXAMPLES: Someone who reads is a reader.

Someone who walks is a walker.
