## Cleopatra and Julius Caesar

Julius Caesar was a Roman general and stateman. When he arrived in Egypt in 48 BC, Cleopatra had been removed from the palace and the Egyptian throne by her younger brother, Ptolemy XIII. But Cleopatra was determined to regain her rightful place as Pharoah. She managed to get back into the palace by hiding in a rolled up carpet. There, she met with Julius Caeser and convinced him to help restore her to power.
