

Cohesive Devices: Pronouns

In cohesive writing, the ideas of sentences and paragraphs are connected together at the sentence level in a way that supports the controlling idea of a text. The word "cohesive" comes from a Latin word that means "cleave together." Cohesion in writing is achieved by the use of different kinds of cohesive devices (also called cohesive ties). One kind of cohesive tie is a pronoun that refers back to a previously mentioned noun.
