### **doubles**

Bronte groups characters, places, and themes into pairs; the novel has two distinct narrators

### **repetitions**

time runs in cycles and the past repeats itself. For example:

Heathcliff's degradation of Hareton repeats Hindley's degradation of Heathcliff.

Young Catherine's scorn of Joseph's earnest evangelical zealousness repeats that of her mother.

Heathcliff opens Catherine's grave twice.

### **nature vs. culture**

Catherine, Heathcliff, and Wuthering Heights represent nature; Thrushcross Grange and the Linton family represent culture, civilization, class, etc.
