In fiction, a premise is a succinct expression of the main idea of the story. Writers use a premise to get a firm idea of what their story is about and where it is going. get a firm idea of what it is you are writing about, and what you want that writing to accomplish. The premise of a story should contain all five elements below in a single sentence.

A synopsis is a summary of a story that includes major characters, plot points, conflicts, and themes. A synopsis can vary in length but is longer than one sentence.

An outline is an overview or a plan for a work. It is organized by sections or chapters and includes headings, subheadings, and bullets of information the author wants to make sure to include.
