

## **Deductive Reasoning**

Deductive reasoning means making an inference based on information that is well known and widely accepted. When you deduce something, you reason from one (or more) statements to arrive at a logical conclusion. In deductive reasoning, if the premises (statements you are reasoning from) are true, then the conclusion must also be true. Deductive reasoning works from the top down: it begins with a general assumption and narrows in scope until it arrives at a specific conclusion.
