### **Subtext**

what a reader “reads between the lines”  
information conveyed by the author without being explicitly stated  
arises directly from the text

### **Both Subtext and Context**

both have to do with additional information about a text that is not  
explicitly on the page  
both have to do with a reader getting a deeper understanding of  
a text

### **Context**

helps a reader interpret and understand the story  
it is the external environment in which the story was created or  
exists (i.e., society, circumstances of the author’s life, etc.)  
does not arise directly from the text, but influences a text, and  
therefore how it can or should be understood
