



Resolving Lingerin Questions

The resolution of a story follows the climax and ties all the narrative arcs together. The resolution doesn't just end the story, it gives the reader of sense of how the character's lives will continue beyond the end of the story, both for stand-alone stories and series. One of the jobs of the resolution is to resolve any lingering questions the reader may have.

DIRECTIONS: Brainstorm what lingering questions you may need to address in your resolution. Is your reader likely to still have questions about:

- the main conflict of the story?

- any subplots?

- the relationship between any characters?

- the implications of the climax?

- what's next for the characters?
