



Synthesis Essay Outline

A **synthesis essay** is an essay that uses information from multiple sources with different views in order to explain something or to support a new and original claim or idea. A synthesis essay typically follows the five-paragraph essay structure.

Introduction	Describe what your essay will be about. Will it be explanatory or argumentative? Include a thesis statement which highlights your synthesis of the information you plan to present.
First Body Paragraph	Discuss the first element and supporting arguments for your thesis. Include evidence drawn from each source. What do your sources have in common? How are they relevant to your text? Include counterarguments and use your source material to discredit those claims and support your own idea.
Second Body Paragraph	Discuss the second element and supporting arguments for your thesis. Include evidence drawn from each source. What do your sources have in common? How are they relevant to your text? Include counterarguments and use your source material to discredit those claims and support your own idea.
Third Body Paragraph	Discuss the third element and supporting arguments for your thesis. Include evidence drawn from each source. What do your sources have in common? How are they relevant to your text? Include counterarguments and use your source material to discredit those claims and support your own idea.
Conclusion	Restate your thesis. Summarize the main points of your essay. Leave the reader with a thought-provoking statement or idea.
