

Interjections

An interjection is a word or phrase used to express strong feelings like anger, joy, disappointment, annoyance, fear, or surprise. An **exclamation mark** usually sets off interjections that express very strong feelings from the rest of the sentence. For example:



Wow! I can't believe you won the lottery.
