3 <sup>rd</sup> Person Omniscient	Third person points of view keep the reader always removed to some extent from the POV character; the reader is always on the outside looking in.	The narrator knows everything and can go everywhere. There are no limits on what can be shown or told. The narrator can also include commentary.
