1. 3rd person, because there are multiple points of view and you can switch back and forth between them, revealing things to the reader that some of the other characters don't know.
2. 1st person, because with only one point of view, and with the story being told from that point of view, it's harder to create dramatic irony.
3. It could be done by telling a well-known story (like the sinking of the Titanic) from the first person point of view. The audience knows that the ship will sink, but the narrator does not have to know that.
