

# To | Too | Two

The words to, too and two are homophones: they are words that sound the same, but have very different meanings.

**To** is a preposition used to express movement or direction to a point (as to from): *We went to the mall. I will add your name to the list.*

**Too** means also, to a greater degree: *I will have one too. It is too small.*

**Two** is a number: *I have two parents.*
