-ment | -ing Pattern

A suffix is a word part added to the end of a base or root word that modifies or changes the meaning of a word. Sometimes suffixes also change the word's part of speech.

The suffix **-ment** means "concrete result, object, or agent of a (specified) action." Adding the suffix -ment to a verb creates a noun.

The suffix **-ing** means ""one belonging to," "of the kind of," or "one descended from." Adding the suffix -ing to some verbs creates an adjective
